How to Grow your Faith this Summer?

Our daily patterns change a little with the seasons. For June, July and early August many North Dakotans try to squeeze the most out of summer. How do your patterns change? I find myself trying to spend as much time outdoors as possible; more walks, meals on the back deck, time at the lake, boat rides, reading with my toes in the warm beach sand, paddle boarding, ice cream enjoyed on the lawn, and campfires. For some, summer schedules can pull us away from our regular worship routine. How can we adapt, so summer gives us an opportunity to continue growing in our faith?



Here are a few ideas to continue tilling the soil of your faith this summer!

* Listen to faith-filled content. Find a new Podcast to listen to while you drive to the lake, or while you garden. There are a number of really great faith-

based podcasts that can stimulate your thinking: The Bulletin from Christianity Today, Main Street Lutherans, . There are also great **Christian Radio** stations that are worth tuning in for a change. Locally you can try: 100.7 FM.

* **Read a new faith-filled book.** Zion has a tremendous library of religious books free and open to you to explore in the Christian Education hallway. Grab one any day during summer church office hours (8am-5pm Mon-Thurs. and Friday 8am-noon.) or at worship Saturday at 5pm and Sunday at 10am. Some interesting titles currently in stock include: 'God Will Carry You Through' by Max Lucado, and 'Reaching for the Invisible God' by Philip Yancey.

* Watch Zion's worship online. You are so fortunate that your church offers really excellent livestreamed worship Sundays at 10am during the summer. Our custodian and IT/AV expert keeps the view interesting, changing camera angles and fine-tuning the audio. The services are recorded so you can watch them anytime during the week.

* Camps are a great chance to grow. Many of our youth will attend camps during the summer including our beloved Metigoshe Lutheran Camp. We also host at Zion our Vacation Bible Camp Tues. June 3rd-6th for grades 1-6 at 9am-3pm and our Pre-school and Kindergarten age Camp 9-12:30 June 3-5th. Plus, this year we have mini-camps mid-June at Zion for two nights on topics like Baking, Crochet, Hockey, Soccer, or Writing. Camp experiences are shown to help young people develop their faith for a life-time and grow their connection with their church long-after they are confirmed.

* Zion Walkers provides an opportunity to walk and socialize. Wednesdays all summer meet at the church by the outside cross for a quick moment of prayer before we walk around the neighborhood. We take different paths each day. You'll usually find us Wednesdays at 1pm walking through the area. For those working, consider taking a late lunch break and joining us. Come once this summer or many times.

* Try a new Devotion this summer. Christ in Our Home is available free by the water fountain at Zion. There are also some devotions and prayer books in the church library, or in our local bookstores. Pastor Elaine wrote a new Bible Study that has been published by Next Sunday Resources, it follows the June Old Testament readings. 

Did you know that the very first 6th grade class I worked with at Zion is now graduating this year? -Kortni's brain

Let's take a trip down memory lane—about 2,453 days ago, or 6 years, 9 months, and 15 days ago, for those of us who don't like doing quick math—I started my ministry at Zion Lutheran. I was filled with a mix of excitement and nervousness, not knowing exactly what I was getting myself into teaching 6th-12th graders. Then I met this group of 6th graders, and if I'm being honest, they scared me to my core. Suddenly, I was the one in charge of guiding their faith journeys.

Little did I know, this class would teach me more than any of them could ever know. They taught me to be more curious about my faith, to serve with more joy, and—perhaps most importantly—how to defuse a disagreement quickly. This class gave me my first grey hair, my first Christmas gift as a "teacher," and my first "OMG, you won't believe what was said in confirmation last night" story. They also gave me my first "how do I break through to this kid?" moment. I never thought the day would come when I would have to say, "See you later" to the very first class of 6th graders who helped shape the youth director I am today.

Fast forward to this past Mother's Day. There I was, standing in front of 24 kids from that first class, sending them off into the world with their new quilts. I looked out and saw those little faces that had grown into young men and women. I thought of all the stories, laughter, and even the tough moments we shared together. And when it was all said and done, I cried. Not because anything went wrong, or because I won't see these kids again, but because I am so proud of each and every one of them.

Class of 2025, always remember—you are so deeply loved, not only by our Creator but by your Zion family—and, of course, by your awkward 6th grade confirmation teacher.

God of guidance, be with all 2025 graduates as they venture out into this new world. Amen.
