

May $31^{\text {st }}$ to June $2^{\text {nd }}$ over 250 members of the Western North Dakota Synod, Pastors and members from WND synod congregations, gathered for the first time in Watford City for our annual Synod Assembly. The highlight for me was the Friday Preassembly Workshop JUST move with Joe Davis and David Scherer. More than 150 participants were invited into a "brave space" of learning about culture and living together with cultural differences. Through music, poetry, skits, and storytelling, they drew the participants into new insights and awareness. With an opening story of the man who was paralyzed and let down by his friends through the roof (Mark 2), they wondered together where we sometimes need to "cut a hole in the roof, in the roof, in the roof?" They helped the group think about our "Why" for pursuing justice and cultural awareness, what will be compelling enough to keep us going, and what "lenses" we use to see our neighbor. And they shared a helpful definition of culture, that it's people who have figured out how to "do life together." They also explained results from a synod-wide cultural assessment, which I was part of, and offered tools on how we might just move as a community on an intercultural continuum. I will continue to work with Dave and Joe with 6 lunch and learn zoom workshops "Becoming Breach Repairers in a polarized world."


The voting members of the 2024 Synod assembly passed the Western ND Synod Ministry financial plan for 2025 and the 2025 compensation guidelines for Rostered Ministers. Assembly Offerings totaled $\$ 13,540.91$ ! $\$ 2,669.00$ will go to ELCA World Hunger. $\$ 7472.91$ will go to our global companion synod the Lutheran Church in the Central African Republic. $\$ 3,399.00$ will go to our synods 4 Bible camp ministries. So much happens over the 48 hours that we gather. We worship together, we reconnect with colleagues, meet new people, learn together, and eat together. Every year we look for people in our congregation to be voting delegates. Over the next year take time to discern if you would like to join Pastor Natasha and Pastor Elaine for a weekend of getting to know more about your Church.
