Guidance for Personal Finances



75% of working Americans report they are stressed about personal finances. In fact, finances currently rank as the #1 stress for a majority of Americans. Stress about finances is even one of the leading causes of divorce. So, in our current Godly Health & Wellness sermon series it was good to contemplate Financial Wellness. As faithful people, there is no part of our lives untouched by our faith. Spending decisions are spiritual decisions. Greater peace with our money is something many of us seek. Zion's YouTube channel and Facebook page has the sermon recorded from Sun Jan. 14th and Wed. Jan. 17th on Financial Wellness. We wanted to continue this conversation, so here are 10 Faith-filled Financial Principles for you to consider.

- •God owns it all. We are managers of everything entrusted to us. Manage wisely, in ways that fulfill God's purposes. Is God mostly pleased with my financial decisions?
- •Put God first. Because we choose to put God first, giving is essential. Christians do not seek to only meet our personal needs, but to further grow God's ministry, and seek to meet the needs of others.
- •Saving is wise. 'The wise man saves for the future, but the foolish man spends whatever he gets. '(Proverbs 21:20) Faithful financial experts suggest 'when we receive income, the first check we write should be to the Lord, the second check for our savings.'
- •Avoid debt. While debt may be difficult to avoid all together, being cautious about it can lead to greater peace. 'The borrower is servant to the lender.'(Proverbs 22:7b) Debt increases stress contributing to mental, physical, emotional and relationship strain. Aiming to give, save and avoid debt is wise; yet we need grace because this is not easy.
- •Seek contentment. 'Godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into the world, and we can take nothing out of it.'(1 Timothy 6:6-7) Wanting what we don't have produces an endless cycle of undue stress in our lives and can lead to added debt.
- •Budgeting provides peace. Planning allows us to set priorities led by our values, not our lifestyle. Jesus instructed his disciples, "For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not sit down first and count the cost, whether he has enough to finish." (Luke 14:28)
- •There is nothing wrong or immoral about building wealth. 'A good man leaves an inheritance to his children's children.' (Proverbs 13:22) Building wealth allows an individual to give generously, investing in people, programs and missions they value.
- •Avoid guilt. Jesus frees us from every type of regret, shame and sin. We can take our financial life to God in prayer. We are new creations in Christ. There is hope.
- •Have open conversations about money. Within your family, do you freely speak about your financial stress and financial goals? Who do you know who might be carrying financial stress and could use a compassionate and trusting ear?
- •Seek guidance. Educate yourself about financial management. It is never too early or late to grow our understanding so we can be proud of wise financial decision making.

Wed. Feb. 14th begins the season of Lent. Lent is the 6 weeks leading up to Easter. Lent is a time of contemplation and reflection. As we recall Jesus' journey to the cross and sacrifice in love, we assess how we are doing in our personal discipleship. We may choose to 'give up' something during Lent as we aim to grow our faithfulness. We may choose to add something during Lent to deepen our relationship with God. Our Lent Sermon series will explore Disney movies and the fight between good and evil. We'll explore temptations that can steal the abundant life God desires for us.

As we aim to grow in faith, here are some suggestions for how you could honor Lent this year, and some important dates to mark on your calendar. What will you choose to give up for Lent or add?

<u>Give up for Lent:</u> Stop an unhealthy habit from Ash Wednesday until Easter Sunday. Stop watching or listening to something that stresses you out. Purge your home one item a day to donate to charity. Give up complaining.

Add for Lent: Read a daily devotion during Lent or read the Gospel of Mark. Compliment one person a day. Pray for one person a day using your contact list. Call one family member or friend a week during Lent. Add a mealtime prayer daily if this isn't your usual habit. Write a gratitude journal, adding each day something different you are thankful for until Easter. Aim to attend worship every week during Lent, in person or online.

- •Tues. Feb. 13th Shrove Tuesday or Fat Tuesday. We'll be celebrating with an Indulgent Meal and Carnival.
- Wed, Feb. 14th Ash Wednesday worship 6:15-7pm with imposition of ashes
- •Sun. March 17th Palm Sunday & Kids Sabbath, and the start of Holy Week
- •Thurs. March 28th Maundy Thursday worship
- •Fri. March 29th Good Friday worship

Sun. March 31st - Easter Sunday worship


We want to celebrate YOU!



"Are YOU listening?"

Todd and I attended our first Holy Listening event last Sunday regarding the Northern Plains Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) with Christal Halseth, CAC Executive Director. We were shocked, amazed, and dismayed by the things we heard. The CAC helps children who have been affected by abuse, including sexual abuse. They partner with several other agencies (law enforcement, schools, social services, etc.) to minimize the trauma to children while the case is being investigated. The statistics we heard were startling! Children that are abused are typically afraid to tell their

parents but are much more likely to tell their friends. 1 in 4 girls and 1 in 9 boys will be affected by abuse. That means that out of our 60+ confirmation students at Zion, 10-15 have been or are currently being affected! Only 1 in 500 children who say they were abused are not telling the truth yet many adults believe the accused not the child. Part of the reason I agreed to share this information with you is because I want to encourage people to talk to and listen to children. Take them seriously, treat them with respect, and support them. I also want children/youth to know that if something is happening to you, we want you to speak up. You are not alone. There are people who can help stop what is happening and help you to heal from the trauma of what has happened. As your church family, we care about you and want you to get the support you need. Please talk to your teacher, pastor, a friend's parent, or police officer if you need help. We ALL have the responsibility to report suspected child abuse. A child's life or well-being could depend on it.



God, you love us deeper and wider then we could ever know. Help us recognize this love as we walk through this Lenten season.


