



Outdoor Enhancement Team Update

- We are in the process of receiving several bids for Earth work, Concrete Work, Fencing and Electrical. We are hopeful and optimistic that a portion of this project can be started <u>early this spring!</u> We will be sharing specific opportunities for the congregational members to hep including building the small 3-sided playhouses. Be watching for more details.
- The plan is to enhance God's Creation experience at Zion. A portion of the land will be developed to be better used by ALL ages: small group meetings at the picnic tables, prayer, baptisms, sledding hill for winter, walking space to enjoy the outdoors, block parties, summer worships/potlucks, lawn croquet, scavenger hunts, cornhole nights, gaga ball tournaments.
- Last September, 6 of the 8 <u>Benches/Picnic Tables</u> were designed by Jared Kolles and built by many congregational members during several community build days here at Zion. The materials were sold to Zion at a discounted price from Minot Lumber & Hardware (30% savings which was equal to about \$450). Labor Costs were approximate \$6,300 but because the congregation was willing to come help build four different days; we saved 100% of labor costs.
- Total Savings for the project has been \$6,750 so far because we have had congregational involvement.
- Zion moved to this location in 2006 with a strong desire to be located in a neighborhood in order to have green space for worship and play.
- 2019 Stewardship drive included 4 initiatives based on our Guiding Principles
 and approved by the congregation at the Annual Meeting in 2020. One of
 these initiatives included the enhancement of our green space on the north
 side of our building. The focus of this green space was to include a natural
 playscape to be enjoyed by all generations, and a pavilion/worship space for
 outdoor worship and events. Elements have been designed to be accessible
 for all ages and abilities.

The Outdoor Enhancement Team was formed and consists of the following people: Kristi Asendorf, Mandy Fiske, Jared Kolles, Tara Miller, Bill Thomas, Chris Torgeson, Sara Brentrup (Children's Garden Preschool), (Eric Burckhard, Pastor Natasha and Pastor Elaine have also attended meetings as part of the team).









Curious about our DREAM BOX?

First, here are some of the ideas we received that we are <u>currently pursuing</u>:

Wednesday Night Worship year round (Wed. worship begins weekly July 4th), Communication improvement/ worship Bulletins (weekly worship announcement handouts started in April), Curb Appeal (Council made an investment in lawn treatments for this season, and conversations about outdoor flowers have begun), Adult Bible Study (Wed. noon Lectionary-based Bible Study began after Easter), More Familiar Hymns, "I love that our church does funerals for Non-Members", New Church Photo Directory.

Second, here are the ideas we heard from you and are contemplating for the future:

Prayer Partners, Life Groups again, Sacristy Notes updated, A New Member Committee (Welcoming & Hospitality team is expected to begin next year), Fundraisers/ Events (any groups desiring to lead a special event or fundraiser are invited to speak to the pastors), Bell Choir (we have the instruments and will be inquiring about potential leaders for re-starting this program), "I dream our church would become RIC (Reconciled in Christ) and welcoming to all" (We have a group that has been learning about this process for the past two years and continues to learn), More Contemporary Music,



Third, here are the ideas we heard that we feel are not a priority at this time:

Lead a Vacation Bible School at a mobile home park, 8:30am Sunday worship begin again (Post-pandemic worship numbers are not at the point of requiring an additional Sunday morning service, and we do feel we have enough musicians to spread into a recurring second Sunday service. We will continue to monitor this need, as we know some deeply miss this worship time.), Altar Rail for Communion, "Go to God & Go Green" (we will continue to pursue earth friendly practices as a church and evangelism, but there are no specific plans at this time), Lutefisk Supper (not pursuing at this time, but fundraising meals are on our radar), Have a room just for a Library (there are plans for this in phase two of our building), Paint the Grapes in the Sanctuary purple (the artist's original intent was not to paint the grapes).

*Ideas are listed in order they were received, and then organized by our response. Each idea was discussed with church staff and presented to Church Council. Thank you for your ideas. May will be the last month the Dream Box will be present this year.

Book Club Book of the Month for May



True crime writer Wylie Lark doesn't mind being snowed in at the isolated farmhouse where she's retreated to write her new book. A cozy fire, complete silence. Zion is a member congregation of Metigoshe Ministries. The annual meeting was recently held Sunday, April 16, 2023 at the Christian Center, Lake Metigoshe.

Several reports were given, including a Treasurer's report, President's report and Executive Director's report. A budget for the coming year was approved, and four new board members were elected.



Information was given on the following:

- ♦ Work day at the camp is scheduled for June 3
- ♦ The strategic plan is near completion, with board approval remaining
- ♦ Camp attendance is expected to be back to pre-covid level this year
- On-going help is always welcome at the camp, especially Wednesday and Thursday during the summer.
- ♦ Member churches are encouraged to put a work group together and spend a day at the camp site anytime.
- ♦ Zion received four camperships of \$50 each to assist Zion youth who attend camp. The ministry also has a campership fund to provide additional assistance to any youth if needed.

All necessary and required business was completed. The ministry is in good order.
