### **Stewardship Info for 2024**

Official Pledge Card Blessings will happen for two weeks in November, the weekends of Nov. 11-12 & 18-19, and Wednesday the 8 &15. A Pledge box will be available to confidentially deposit your pledge card as you approach for communion. Last year we had 132 pledge cards received. We have 362 active giving families. Our goal this year is 150 pledges! Help us grow our giving at Zion.

Why pledge? Pledges help our church Council by knowing the amount of giving

income we can expect in the coming year. It helps us set a budget with more confidence and less guessing. It gives the Council peace of mind to know that we can pay the bills without stress, because a large group of people have committed to sharing in this good work together. You can notify the church at any time during the year, should your



circumstances change and your ability to give increases or decreases. Pledges give the church a solid financial baseline.

How does my pledge work? You complete the pledge card received in the mail (or use one at the church) with your estimated annual giving to Zion. You place your pledge in the pledge envelope. This can be placed in the pledge box during worship on the dates listed above, mailed, or delivered to the church office. The only person who sees your pledge amount is our Office Manager. Pledges, like all giving information, are kept confidential. The financial total of all pledges is given to Council who begins work on the 2024 budget in late November. Your pledge amount is also included on your quarterly statements from Zion, so you can track how your giving is

progressing.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

Aunt Debbie's mashed potatoes, Grandma Sharon's green-bean casserole and Dad's smoked Turkey, but how mindful are we of the amount of waste we are creating from all this food? This Holiday season, try cutting the recipe down a bit or using those leftovers in new recipes! Let us all be better stewards of the resources God has given us! Enjoy your Thanksgiving meal wisely. You're so smart and kind!

#### **Heat Fundraiser**

Final bids are being received by Building & Grounds committee. Since April the committee has been talking with engineers and companies who have presented options. We are now on our third option with three bids. The space we have to put a replacement heat pump for the sanctuary has complicated the process, but the committee feels comfortable with the final decision that all three companies decided as best. We hope to have a final price for the congregation next month. The cost will be over our initial \$75,000 estimate. The congregation has currently raised \$10,700 for the Heat Pump replacement. You can continue to contribute to this financial need with gifts marked 'Heat'. Thank you!

#### **Congregational Renewal Update**

Zion Lutheran, as part of the Lilly Grant received by Pastor Natasha, contracted with LeaderWise to engage in the Bridgebuilder process with the goal of discerning congregational identity and enhancing congregational renewal. The desired outcome for this work, which took place in September and October, is for the church to have the opportunity to gain knowledge of who it has been, who it is today, and how that informs congregational renewal and growth.

We were presented with a written learning report on Oct. 12<sup>th</sup> that identified our strengths and challenges/anxieties along with some observations, wonderings, and recommendations. Here are a few highlights...

Strengths

Family - positive comments were made about the role of children and families in the church, including the high quality of the church school program, the inclusion of children in worship, and the flexibility afforded to families by the availability of worship 3 days per week. "Family" was the most-mentioned value, the spiritual well-being of individual families is one of Zion's

central values and a key aspect of its identity.

Leadership – many stories were shared about how different pastors through the years had touched their lives. Values associated with leadership such as "Education," "Creativity," "Vision," and "Worship" were frequently named.

Community Involvement - outreach to and support of the Minot community was named as a strength and as an area where they would like to see growth. Zion members raised up values relating to community involvement such as "Inclusiveness," "Compassion," and "Making a Difference."

#### **Challenges/Anxieties**

Financial Resources - Concern for diminishing financial support of the church from congregational giving. Whether or not the church's income has actually diminished is not as important as the fact that the perception that this is true creates a great deal of anxiety among the congregation and staff.

Volunteers - Another area of anxiety is that the number of people who volunteer in the church is dwindling.

A comment from the presenters; "Zions strengths are unique to Zion and our challenges are common to other churches."

The report in its entirety along with observations, wonderings, and recommendations are available in the church office.

In the next month we will be putting together a team of 5-8 members that will work with Leaderwise to determine goals and courses of action that best fit the church and its people.
