Grace and peace to you all! I am grateful to be back with you all after my three-month Sabbatical. I thank the Lilly Endowment for the once in a lifetime opportunity for my family and I to travel to Europe. I would also like to thank the congregational leadership for having put in place years ago the importance of clergy renewal, knowing that rest and renewal are important to the life of ministry. During my Sabbatical I learned a lot about taking care of myself, my family, and being present.

Which brings me to this...have you ever heard of "spam bot"? A "spam bot" is an automated account that is programmed by robots using algorithms and hackers to engage in potentially deceptive, harmful, or annoying activity. In other words, social media is dangerous to our mind, spirit, and mental health as Pastor Nadia Bolz-Weber wrote in her recent article, "Our Drug of Choice Right Now is Knowing Who We're Better Than". (A side note: I acknowledge to some degree that there are also living giving groups and friendships on social media. It's complex.) Pastor Nadia states that social media is our bolus button, "A couple years ago, when I re-tweeted someone's super mean comment (something about women or gays - I can't remember), it was pointed out to me that the comment was from a brand new account, without a profile pic, and had only four followers. I assumed that an actual person was saying these ideologically-laden things to me, things that made me feel outraged. And (just like each time this same thing happens), when I felt that fire of outrage, I directed the heat of my disgust toward everyone in this country who I believe is on "that side". She goes on to write about righteousness, how we all think of ourselves at times as righteous and thinking that the other side is sinful or wicked. Although as we all know, but maybe don't want to admit it. we are all sinful no matter what side your on. She goes on to contemplate that "sin, a flaw that consistently causes errors in our relationships, is like a loop inside of us that manipulated messages on social media and hooks into and then pulls us apart – from our best selves and from each other."

You maybe wondering why is Pastor bringing this up in our fall newsletter. Part of my Sabbatical practice was and is a break from social media. For two months I haven't gotten sucked into the negative comments or Facebook posts that have me curling up into a ball and hoping that when I wake up the world will be a kinder place. When I read Pastor Nadia's article it all made sense. She even ties in the Gospel in her article stating that "*Jesus would make a lousy Instagram influencer*." If Jesus was on social media it would never go viral because Jesus' messages don't make us feel superior. For example, Jesus tweets: You have heard it said, you shall not commit adultery. (You instantly think Amen Jesus I have been loyal to my spouse I am good!) Then Jesus adds, But I say to you that everyone who looks at another with lust has already committed adultery in their heart. Nadia writes "Everyone around Jesus that day who considered themselves righteous because they had not cheated on their spouse were pretty bummed that Jesus would take that ranking away from them so quickly. But he doesn't up the ante to be mean. He ups the ante so that we realize how futile the human righteousness ranking system is."

The black hole of social media is the ranking system. Comparing ourselves for better or worse with photo-shopped pictures, clever video edits, and not to mention spam bots. The cost is broken relationships, disconnect from reality, mental health, and moving us further away from the Creator who loves us madly. Where's the hope in all this complexity, because let's admit it, social media isn't going anywhere. Once again Nadia eloquently clarifies for us, "*The Gospel confronts us in our virtue and says You need not rely on your ability to be better than others. Lay down the ranking system. Walk away from your projects of self-perfection. None of it matters. You can stop trying to earn-by-comparison what has already been freely given to you: your freedom, your blessedness, your right to be loved."*

Thank you, Pastor Nadia, for your thoughtful insight. Thank you, Lilly Endowment and the community of Zion. You are loved beyond measure.

The Call Committee has been working on the process for calling a new pastor since the end of June. Their work began by creating a project plan to outline approximately 60 steps that need to be taken between the time that the committee initially met and the time that a new pastor will be installed. They meet regularly and are currently implementing a series of steps to complete the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). The MSP is designed to stimulate reflection within Zion's congregation, to be a summary of the characteristics and ministry of the church, and to serve as the first impression that Zion wishes to give to prospective candidates. Upon completion of the MSP, the Call Committee will submit it to the Western North

Dakota Synod. The synod will use the information in the MSP to help identify potential candidates for Zion's open pastor position. The Call Committee invites you to contribute to the completion of the MSP by participating in a survey designed to help identify the top ministry tasks and gifts for ministry that the congregation desires in a new pastor. The survey is intended to be completed by all members of Zion's congregation and may be submitted online or completed on paper and then turned in to the church office. Your participation in the survey will help ensure that your

voice is heard in the call process and that the MSP depicts an accurate representation of Zion's needs and desires.
