



Hope at Zion this Advent

Luke's gospel begins the story of Jesus with this opening line: "In the time of Herod ..." This detail may seem minor to modern readers, however, it reveals layers of information about the fearful world Jesus entered, one filled with rampant oppression, economic disparity, uncertainty, and instability. A world not so unlike our own. And yet, throughout the stories of Christ's birth, we hear the whispers of angels delivering a surprising message: "Do not fear." In our own time, we might ask: is it even possible to be fearless in a fearful world? When Mary, Joseph, the shepherds, and the magi are each called into God's redemptive story, they do not deny their fears - they move through them. They ask questions, hold fast to courage, trust in good news, and say, "Here I am, Lord." When we find ourselves in fearful times, can we acknowledge our fears while also insisting on hope?

Every Advent, we light candles, sing carols, and pray for Christ's coming because we believe God entered a frightened world to bring good news. Our hope is born with Jesus. Our hope, as people of faith, is gritty, resilient, beautiful, strong, and enduring. No matter what we fear or face, God is with us. This advent, let us insist on hope. Let us trust that good news is greater than fear! This advent you will see lanterns in our worship. You will see light in our sanctuary shining deliberately in these darker December days. Your voice in worship can join in praise to God, uplifting us all in hope with familiar carols of joy. I pray that in worship this Advent, your soul will find peace and hope will be stirred.

**'O little town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie!
Above thy deep and dreamless sleep the silent stars go by;
yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting light.
The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight.'**





Poinsettias for Christmas

Poinsettias are not just a pretty flower, they have an interesting history connected with Christmas.

Symbolism: The red leaves of the poinsettia are often interpreted as representing the blood of Christ, while the star-like shape of the plant symbolizes the Star of Bethlehem.

Mexican origins & connection with Nativity Scenes: The poinsettia is native to Mexico, where indigenous people used it for decorative purposes, and later, Franciscan friars incorporated it into nativity scenes in the town of Taxco.

Legend of Pepita: A popular Mexican legend tells the story of a poor girl named Pepita who offered a humble bouquet of roadside weeds as a gift to the baby Jesus on Christmas Eve, which miraculously transformed into beautiful poinsettias.
