As summer turns to fall the landscape of our community changes. Along with all the happenings at Zion this fall, you all will be invited to engage in a

**congregational renewal process** with the church consultant group, Leaderwise. This is an opportunity that has been afforded to us by the generosity of the Lilly Grant I received in 2020. A portion of this grant was designated for congregational renewal. We will be exploring where have we been, where are we, and what God is calling us to do. This process is led by Cindy Halvorson and Becca Fletcher of Leaderwise Church consultants. During this process there will be many opportunities for the congregation to be actively involved in the conversations about our history, our present, and our future. We have already started this process with the church council and Leaderwise. The council brought forward names of members from our congregation of all ages, backgrounds, and gender to be interviewed one on one by our consultants. These interviews will give our consultants an overview of who we are, where our strengths are and where we have challenges.



\*Begin with report, sets priorities, brainstorm and how to implement them


\*Identifies and assembles necessary resources (people, materials, etc.)

## **Important News for RebelGivers!**



We recently identified an error in RebelGive (our online giving system) which has affected some of our regular automatic givers. Some families and individuals who had been giving regularly (like monthly) in 2022, discovered that their automatic giving did not continue in 2023. This has resulted in 8 months of missed givings that they had expected were being automatically withdrawn and given to the church (January through now).

We are asking those who use RebelGive to please check that their automatic givings are working as *intended*. The potential good news is this may explain part or (cross your fingers) nearly all of our \$48,000 operating deficit year to date.

If you have been affected by this RebelGive problem, please contact Zion's church treasurer Erica Atkinson at ericaatkinson37@gmail.com or call 701-340-0611. If you are able to back-give offerings for previous months, or are able to give an extra financial gift to help bridge our current financial gap; it would be greatly appreciated!

We are researching the source of the original RebelGive problem to see if it was a system update on their end, or some system error on our end. We continue to have good trust in the Rebel Give system and believe this was a one-time problem. We will be increasing financial oversight in this area to prevent future issues. Thank you again for checking that your financial support to Zion is being withdrawn as intended. We are so grateful to each one of you who supports Zion's ministry.

#### Heat Fundraiser



Are you a summer or a winter lover? Regardless of your weather preference you probably prefer somewhere around a constant 70 degree thermostat indoors. Us too. So here is where we could use your help. The main heating system for our sanctuary that is 16 years old, can no longer be repaired. We need to immediately replace it. Gulp. The initial bids are all coming in around \$70,000. Double gulp. Our church now needs to come together and raise \$75,000 quickly (because we all know projects routinely come in over budget and final bids are still being worked out).

### Building & Grounds Update

Doesn't your church look amazing? We are so fortunate to have our awesome Custodian, Eric, who takes such impressive care of our building inside and out. Please say an extra thank you when you see him. Eric has some extra help from Jody Goetz (for interior) and Brooke Plorin (for exterior this summer).

Plus, we have a newly re-activated Building and Grounds committee who are leading decision-making to keep Zion's structure and grounds in great shape. Here are a few projects they are addressing.

- The SW entrance had hoped to have a new awning constructed to assist with a snow issue at that entrance. Due to current financial constraints Building & Grounds committee and Council decided to try a less expensive approach first. A snow fence will be used this year in hopes of keeping that entrance freer of drifts and ice.
- 2) One of our freezers died. Being frugal, a new household grade rather than commercial grade stand up **freezer** will be purchased this fall. The savings was large. Our freezers are well utilized year round for all of the meals and luncheons served.
- 3) Our sanctuary cooling and heating system is unrepairable. Bids continue to be received, but as we await final numbers after exhausting all of the options, a **HEAT** fundraiser of \$75,000 has just begun.
- 4) **Exterior flowers** were planted this summer and watered with love all summer. What a beautiful pop of color around our building.






