I love Holy Week and Easter. Sure, things get a little busier than usual here at the church—but what a gift it is to walk through such sacred days together. The contemplation of Holy Week, the joy of Easter morning... it's holy, beautiful, and deeply meaningful.

Now that Holy Week has passed, and we're wrapping up the year's programming—like church school and confirmation—I find myself asking: *Now what?*

Meet other women of the church while learning, celebrating and being a servant of God through monthly service projects throughout the year.




#### **Zion Walkers**

# May's book is "Lessons in Chemistry"

Chemist Elizabeth Zott is not your average woman. In fact, Elizabeth Zott would be the first to point out that there is no such thing as an average woman. But it's the early 1960s and her all-male team at Hastings Research Institute takes a very unscientific view of equality. Except for one: Calvin Evans; the lonely, brilliant, Nobel–prize nominated grudge-holder who falls in love with—of all things—her mind. True chemistry results.

But like science, life is unpredictable. Which is why a few years later Elizabeth Zott finds herself not only a single mother, but the reluctant star of America's most beloved cooking show Supper at Six. Elizabeth's unusual approach to cooking ("combine one tablespoon acetic acid with a pinch of sodium chloride") proves revolutionary. But as her following grows, not everyone is happy. Because as it turns out, Elizabeth Zott isn't just teaching women to cook. She's daring them to change the status quo.



# DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know "approximately 1.8 million cases of skin caner is diagnosed in the U.S. each year"? -skincancer.org

*Fingers crossed* — it's finally that time of year to spend more time outside! School's almost out, lake houses are opening up, and we're dusting off those lawn chairs. Stores are stocked with new swimsuits, pool floats, and coolers to help us make the most of our short North Dakota summers. But one thing you *shouldn't* pass by on your way to grab that new Slip 'N Slide is sunscreen.

Yes, we know—it can smell a little weird, take a while to rub in, and it might slow down that tan some of us are chasing. But here's the deal: applying sunscreen with SPF 15 or higher can reduce your risk of developing skin cancer by 40%. Back in 2008, the National Council on Skin Cancer Prevention launched National Don't Fry Day to raise awareness about UV exposure and encourage sun-safe habits. It falls on the Friday before Memorial Day—just in time for summer fun.

So before you fill up that kiddie pool or throw on your new shades, don't forget to lather up. A simple layer of sunscreen can help protect you and your loved ones from skin cancer. Stay safe and enjoy the sunshine!
