Lenten sermon series: "God on the Move: Exploring God's Work Through the Travels and Teachings of Jesus"

Jesus didn't stay still. His ministry was one of movements; traveling from town to town, meeting people in their joys and struggles, teaching, healing, and ultimately walking the road to the cross. But Jesus didn't just move across the map; he moved through the full depth of human experience—temptation, rejection, celebration, suffering, and even death.

This Lent, we follow in his footsteps. As we journey through Jesus' ministry—from the wilderness of temptation to the crowded streets of his teaching, from miraculous moments to the painful road to the cross—we recognize that encountering Jesus means change. We cannot stay the same. Jesus' movement stirs us, challenges us, and calls us to transformation.

The good news is that we do not journey alone. The same God who moved through Jesus' life and ministry is still on the move today, walking with us through our own struggles, questions, and growth. As we travel the road to Easter, we trust that God is with us, guiding each step, drawing us closer to Christ, and shaping us into people of the resurrection.

Support Our New Gas Voucher Program!

Caring for one another is at the heart of our mission at Zion. One way we've lived this out is by providing Marketplace gas stamps for those in need. However, with the grocery store program transitioning to an app, it is no longer a viable option for us.

Thanks to the efforts of our Community Outreach Team, especially Melody Sundbakken, we're excited to introduce a new **Gas Voucher Program** in partnership with Simonson Gas Station.

To ensure we can continue offering this support, we're inviting **Zion members to sponsor a month of gas vouchers.** Each month, our goal is to provide a minimum of \$100 in assistance, which equates to **five \$20 gas vouchers.** A \$100 minimum ensures we can provide meaningful assistance to multiple individuals throughout the month, rather than just one-time or limited support.

You can sign up for a month through **SignUp Genius**—whether as an individual, a family, a group, or anonymously. Once signed up, you can contribute in one of two ways:

- Bring a minimum of \$100 to our Office Manager.
- Donate via **RebelGive** by selecting the "Community Outreach" line and noting in the memo:
- "Gas Vouchers for (Month)." This qualifies as a charitable financial gift for tax purposes.

WEED TRIMMER VOLUNTEERS WANTED



In order to save on lawn maintenance expenses Zion Lutheran is looking to the congregation for volunteers willing to offer some time doing Weed Trimming this spring and summer. A calendar will be available with dates you can sign up. You can offer to help as many times as you like, and arrive whatever time works best for you during the week you commit. One cordless Milwaukee Weed Trimmer will be available for your use, or you may use your own if you prefer. Church will reimburse you for your Weed Trimmer replacement spools. **Two people trimming each week are needed.**

Aprox. 1.5-2hrs each. Trimming will cover around trees, flower beds etc. We are hoping for around 10 people to sign up to cover the 21 weeks between April 20th-September 14th. Sign up will be available in the church office and online in March. Help keep Zion beautiful! Our custodian Eric will provide an orientation for all Weed Trimming Volunteers of where trimming is needed on our property and how to utilize our equipment. Please sign up early so we can provide one orientation for everyone. Minimum age 16, because of the equipment. It takes our Custodian, Eric many hours a week to mow our 4 acre lot, so weed work is very much needed from others.
