


Zion Walkers

May's book is "The Immortal Life of Henrietta Lacks" by Rebecca Skloot

Her name was Henrietta Lacks, but scientists know her as HeLa. She was a poor Southern tobacco farmer who worked the same land as her slave ancestors, yet her cells—taken without her knowledge—became one of the most important tools in medicine: The first "immortal" human cells grown in culture, which are still alive today, though she has been dead for more than sixty years. HeLa cells were vital for developing the polio vaccine; uncovered secrets of cancer, viruses, and the atom bomb's effects; helped lead to important advances like in vitro fertilization, cloning, and gene mapping; and have been bought and sold by the billions.



Special Congregation Meeting Report:

Sunday April 14th there was a wonderful attendance for our congregational meeting. The congregation voted to approve the \$38,000 expense for sanctuary heat replacement; \$20,689.21 to come from the Heat Fundraising line, and the remainder to come from the Building Funds Saving Account \$17,310.79. Council was entrusted to create a plan to replenish these Building Funds.

North Central Services will be providing the new heating and cooling system for our sanctuary. Their proposal was for three new natural gas furnaces and three new air conditioning units. With installation, the price is \$36,469.80 plus approximately \$1,000 in wiring supplies. The electrician labor is being donated by a congregation member. The Building and Grounds committee contacted 7 different companies concerning replacement of our sanctuary heating and cooling system and spent 11 months researching the best path forward for our congregation. Four proposals were received. The bid from North Central Services was the option recommended to Council by our Building and Grounds Committee.

Thank you to all who have given money to support this heating and cooling system replacement for the sanctuary! Thank you to our Building & Grounds Committee for their diligent work on this issue.

Seeking Wholeness in Today's World Chris Torgeson's Sabbatical

Wholeness is often defined as the interrelationships between the dimensions of well-being in our lives: physical, vocational, social/relationship, financial, intellectual, emotional and spiritual. Throughout the next three months, I will be spending intentional time exploring each of these areas. Sabbaticals are not a common practice amongst most professions and my hope is to spend time reflecting how we as the church can better equip others to find quality sabbath time in the midst of this busy world ensuring a healthier balance in our lives.

Sabbath/rest in our society is often diminished and undervalued. We live in a world filled with ever-increasing demands on our time and attention. According to the article "A Sabbath Rest for an Anxious World," Rod McNair points out that many are working harder to make ends meet—which often results in anxiety and MORE conflict. Relationships suffer, health suffers, and a sense of hopelessness can be overwhelming.

This is NOT how our Creator designed life to be for us. Many feel stuck in this cycle of doing rather than taking time BEING! When we get caught up in doing, we can become less connected to God, to each other and are unable to see God at work in our world. We can be overcome with compassion fatigue. National Institute of Health defines compassion fatigue as the prolonged exposure to other's trauma and caring for them in a physical, mental, emotional or spiritual manner without rest and self-care.

During this sabbatical, I plan to dive into how I (and, in turn, we) can find wholeness and wellness in today's busy world. I will be reading several books centered around these topics of living into God's design for sabbath as well as reflecting daily on my own self-care and wellness. My hope is to share these insights in a variety of ways with you when I return this fall.

Thank you again for the opportunity to take this period of sabbath and renewal so I will be better equipped to serve you and we may continue to do God's work together.
