Pastor Natasha's Sabbatical 2022 Update

In a couple short months when the sun will set later and the temperatures more conducive to wearing flip flops and t-shirts I will be starting a three-month sabbatical. (May 2-Aug. 2) The word 'sabbatical' is derived from the word sabbath, to rest from one's laborers. Sabbatical according to the dictionary "is a period of paid leave granted to a university teacher or other worker for study or travel, traditionally one year for every seven years worked." Pastoral sabbaticals are typically taken every 5 to 10 years of ordained ministry for a period of 3 to 6 months.

In the fall of 2020, Pastor John encouraged me to apply for a Lilly Clergy renewal grant for the Sabbatical I was to take in the summer of 2021. "Lilly Endowment Clergy Renewal Programs seek to strengthen Christian congregations through renewal and reflection. National Renewal Programs provide an opportunity for pastors to step away from the persistent obligations of daily parish life and engage in a period of renewal and reflection. Renewal periods are not vacations but times for intentional exploration and reflection, for drinking again from God's life-giving waters, for regaining enthusiasm and creativity for ministry."

I quickly formed a sabbatical committee consisting of 4 congregational members and got to work on researching and writing an 8-10 page proposal. On average, clergy have a year to prepare for this grant application. I had less than three months to complete and send in my proposal. With the guidance of the sabbatical committee, Pastor John, and even Pastor Nathan Mugaas, I proposed a sabbatical based on travel and exploring the home of my ancestors. Where have I come from, where am I, and where am I going. This was no easy task as I had set particular high goals of traveling overseas with Jared and the kids in tow. Everything had to be laid out. A narrative, a detailed budget, comments from the sabbatical committee and senior Pastor, and general paperwork. In October of 2020, I received an email from the Lilly Endowment congratulating me on receiving a clergy renewal sabbatical grant. Even Eric heard my surprise and joy from the sanctuary. The press release from the Lilly Endowment is available in the office. 140 grants were rewarded in 2020. This is a highly competitive program and not all receive funding. It is an honor and privilege to receive this grant.

As you may have guessed my sabbatical and grant were put on hold due to the pandemic and an extension was granted. Here we are eagerly waiting to take an adventure of a life time. To walk the places where my ancestors lived and died, where Martin Luther started the Reformation, and to meet people who inhabit places not familiar to us. The thing I am looking most forward to is unplug-ging. Part of my grant proposal was that no electronics except for one Ipad and a cell phone where

to be taken with. That means no kids or adults will have their face glued to a screen. Instead card games, reading, taking in the scenery around you, and so much more.

You'll be able to follow along with us on Kolles Kronicles YouTube channel starting around June 13th. Because what happens on Sabbatical doesn't stay on sabbatical. I hope you have fun watching us explore all the highs and lows of what this adventure will be.

Zion has experienced God's faithful presence for well over a century, and I know that God has a wonderful future in store for this church. In the meantime we need to keep our eyes on the future, always looking for where God might be leading. One of my favorite prayers from the Evening Prayer service in our ELW hymnal is perfect for this time of transition:

O God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go our in good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us. Amen.

Camp Metigoshe is Hiring!



After 2 years of hiring a smaller summer staff of around 30, we would like to return to a summer staff of nearly 50 young women and men in 2022.

We are now able to be back on college campuses – but our relationships aren't quite as strong after 2 years of not being onsite. There is an understandable hesitancy among many college-aged young adults right now to make big commitments because of how much has been lost or put on hold over the past few years. And even with a "normal" returning-staff rate of around

50%, we are a little behind because...well...because of math. Half of 30 is significantly less than half of 50!

Here is my request to each and every one of you. Can you take a half-hour and try to think of 3-5 young adults who you think would make great camp counselors? Once you have that list, would you be willing to call them or – even better – have an in-person conversation to encourage them to think about working at camp? Finally, and most importantly, would you ask them if you could pass their contact information along to our Program Director, <u>Katie Vogel</u> [<u>program@metigosheminiistires.com</u>] so that we could follow up and tell them more about working on summer staff? Thank you!

The Lord's Cupboard Food Pantry Garden 2022



In the spring of 2019, Duane Brekke, who has a farm north of Velva, donated raised garden beds on his farm to The Lord's Cupboard Food Pantry so that a Pantry Garden could be developed. Cucumbers, tomatoes, cabbage, carrots, and squash are some of the vegetable grown in the raised garden beds! Duane's neighbors, Alex & Robert Kasowski, donated potatoes from their fields. In the first

year, over 9,000 pounds of vegetables from the two gardens were distributed at the Lord's Cupboard. Additional beds were added in the spring of 2020 and production increased to over 13,000 pounds of vegetables. Volunteer gardeners are able to sign up and tend garden two mornings each week from June—September, taking care of the planting, weeding and harvesting. Many individuals, church groups, as well as businesses participate. Everyone is welcome to volunteer. It is because of these volunteers that The Lord's Cupboard Food Pantry Garden can be successful.
