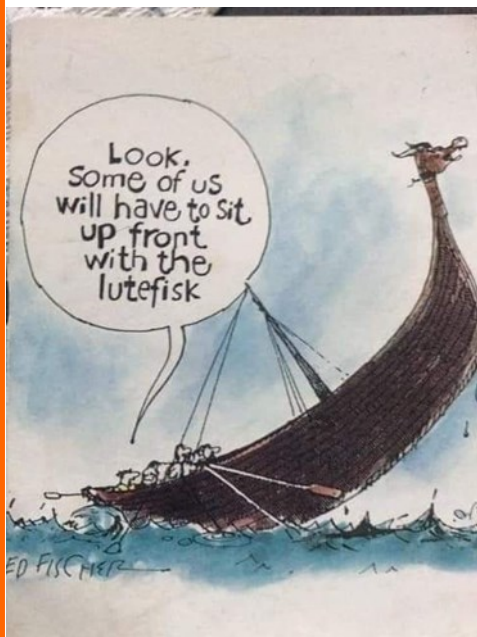




WHY LUTEFISK MATTERS?

We just had our first Lutefisk & Meatball Supper in 5 years! It was a rousing success. We are still calculating totals, but are confident we fed more than 700 people, and will have raised a substantial amount of money for Zion. Here are some reasons why events like this are so valuable to the church.

- 1) Zion's Lutefisk Supper involved more than 150 volunteers. It was an intergenerational event with both those eating and serving ranging from children to seniors. Working and eating together builds bonds and **strengthens relationships within the church.**
- 2) People live out their faith in many different ways. Some people are doers, so the opportunity to plan and serve is energizing for their faith. This event **activated a large number of people who enjoy putting their faith into action.**
- 3) We had a wonderful group of individuals we haven't seen recently at Zion who joined in this event, and a number of new members who had the opportunity to become better integrated with the congregation as they worked shoulder to shoulder. Our Lutefisk supper **welcomed a number of new and older faces.**
- 4) This fundraiser was a great opportunity to welcome the community into our building. Positive interactions with Zion are so valuable as we **grow our relationship with the Minot area community.**
- 5) Aside from Offerings, and Investment Income, Fundraisers are the next biggest income source for Zion. **Proceeds from fundraisers keep Zion financially fit** and enable us to provide meaningful ministry year-round.



You can probably think of other good reasons that an event like our Lutefisk Supper is an asset for Zion. I saw so many smiling faces Sat. Sept. 21st, and in the weeks prior as the planning was unfolding. Thank you to all who supported this event, especially our Lutefisk leader, Joe Stenvold, and his team. 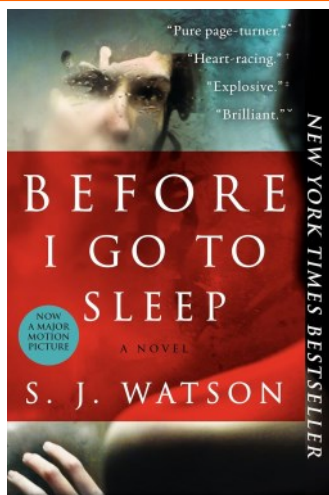
Zion Church Photo Directory

New Group OWLS:

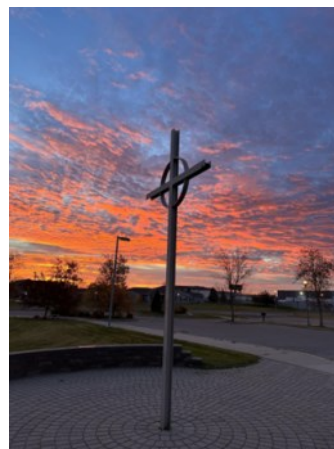

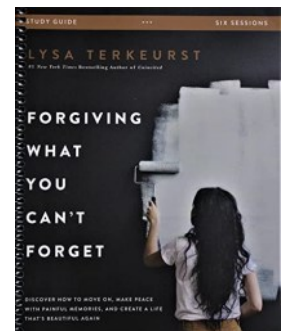
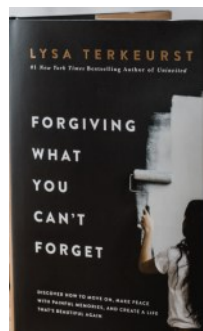

Picture this, it's the summer of 2015, I, a very anxious 20 year old was on my way to my new summer job at Camp Metigoshe where I would be for the next 12 weeks. I cried the entire drive up to camp and thought, "There is no place for me here. Why did I decide to do this?" By the time I had made it to camp, I had convinced myself there had been a mistake in the hiring process and they didn't actually mean to hire me. Why would a summer camp want me? I didn't have a strong faith and I was much quieter then, than I am now. (I know, shocking)

Fast forward a week and my anxiety started to calm and I had found a new friend who a couple weeks later said something that has stuck with me for almost 10 years now. She said "All God's children got a place in the choir." At the time I'm sure she was referencing to someone saying they couldn't sing, but as time went on, the more I thought about what she said. We join choirs, churches, book clubs, gym, etc. to find our place of belonging. Sometimes it takes some trial and error, but you will find your "choir." During my first summer at Camp Metigoshe, I found my place, my people and myself. I found out that there is always room in God's choir, band, table, house, family, church. You don't have to be anyone other then yourself to belong. Find those friends that give you silly quotes and a place where you belong.

God of Love, you called us to be in relations with others. Help us find those people and places where we feel like we belong and remind us that we are always welcomed in your choir.
