Grief is like a shadow that follows you even when there is no light. Everyone experiences grief. No one is immune, for if there is life then there is death. Grief is not linear, it's more like a toddler's refrigerator art project, zigzagging lines accumulating on the page like destruction after a storm. I've had the honor to lead several grief support groups. These groups provide a safe place to tell your story. To share in a sort of collective grief that can look different for everyone yet similar at the same time. These groups create lifelong connections between people, provide a space to express your grief, and to heal. It's important to acknowledge that grief doesn't have an ending. One day the world may finally

feel 'normal' and the next moment that shadow catches up to you. Even Jesus grieved. When his beloved friend, Lazurus died, Jesus saw Mary weeping and the Jews who came with her also weeping, he was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved. He said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Lord, come and see." Jesus began to weep. So the Jews said, "See how he loved him!" (John 11:33-36) To grieve is to know love.

The Bible is full of stories that can support us in our grief. Starting January 19th I will be leading a 6-week grief support group using the lenses of Scripture to guide us. There will be two groups. A Sunday evening support group from 6pm-7:30pm and a Friday afternoon group 1pm-2:30pm. Choose what time and day works best for you to attend. These groups are confidential and will support you in your grief journey. O matter where you are in your grief journey, how fresh or distant your loss is, this grief support group will benefit you. 




